

Week 23 | May 12 Sermon

Community:

Let's talk about moms this week. Happy Mother's Day to all the moms—physical and spiritual—who mean so much to our family! None of us would be here without them!

As you probably heard if you have shared your stories with your GROUP, we all have different experiences with, thoughts about, feelings toward our moms. This isn't designed to be a light and fluffy conversation. It might be that, but it also might be tough for some. Acknowledge that and the desire for authenticity and vulnerability in sharing with your GROUP before you pose these questions related to moms.

- What is/was the best thing about your mom?
- What is one hard thing you went through with your mom?
- Is/was your physical mother also a spiritual mother to you? What did you learn from her? Are there other women in your life you consider to be spiritual mothers?

Close this time with a prayer of blessing for all the moms in our community.

Let us think of ways to motivate one another to acts of love and good works. And let us not neglect our meeting together, as some people do, but encourage one another, especially now that the day of his return is drawing near. **Hebrews 10:24-25**



Sermon Title: You win some & you lose some | Text: Acts 17

Auditorium Discussion Questions::

- Read Acts 17 together. What are you feeling about the people in each city and how they agreed or disagreed with Paul's message?
- In what ways, either clearly or under the surface, do you see fear operating in these accounts?
- Thinking about being "Kingdom Sent" this year what are some things that keep you from being a witness?

Have you mis-named some of these things in your life that, at their root - are actually fear? How does identifying fear make you feel about it?

If you are comfortable, name the fear or other things that have gone unnamed or mis-named in your life that keep you from "agreeing" with your call to be "Kingdom Sent". Then pray together like in Ephesians 3:14, that your spirits would be strengthened by His Spirit to know his deep and perfect love for you. The love that drives out fear. And that he would embolden you to live as witnesses wherever he may lead you.

Sanctuary Discussion Questions::

Please read Acts 17. What does the Holy Spirit draw your attention to in this passage? How do you respond to Kevin's observation about the raging spiritual battle in Acts 17?
