## Sermon Title: What to do With Such a Troublemaker? Part 3 | Text: Acts 24:1-27

### **Auditorium Discussion Questions::**

Do you see evidence of these concepts from Acts 1 in your life?

God's promise of the Holy Spirit?

The power of the Holy Spirit?

God's purpose?

If, in the eyes of the world, the Gospel is always on trial, how does your life influence the verdict?

Do you ever feel Satan is accusing or trying to prosecute you?

Are there examples in your life of events occurring "under the surface"?

Do you put your heart on trial? If so, how? What tools do you use?

#### **Sanctuary Discussion Questions::**

Please read and discuss Acts 24. What does the Holy Spirit draw your attention to?

Dr. Luke raises the important idea of living a blameless life in three of Paul's last speeches (23:1; 24:16; 25:8). Kevin offered historical evidence revealing the influence of this kind of lifestyle.

What words would others (especially non-believers) use to describe your lifestyle?

What does the answer reveal about your life as a witness for Christ and His Kingdom?

In 24:25 Paul talks to Gov. Felix and his wife Drusilla about three things:

Righteousness. Self-control. The judgment to come.

Why were these important to Paul?

Are these important to you? Why or why not?

Gov. Felix's response in 24:25-27 reveals a "heart under attack." The words fear, greed and (seeking) favor were used. Do these attitudes impact the hearth of your heart (and thus, your witness for Christ and His Kingdom)?

What do you understand about the Final Judgment (cf. Revelation 20:7-22:7)? Do you consider this is as you live your days? Does it influence how "blamelessly" and "beautifully" you reveal the Kingdom of God to others? Why or why not?

Please consider closing your meeting by praying for one another. Pray specifically for a "blameless and Christ-honoring lifestyle" this week.
