Community:

Sermon Title: Destination Rome Part 1 | Text: Acts 27

Auditorium Discussion Questions::

What was the scariest (actual) storm you've ever experienced?

- Paul was able to maintain a sense of calm in the middle of an unbelievably stressful situation. What may have contributed to his sense of peace and contentment?
- Tom talked about several specific storms from scripture, as the theme of storms is quite prevalent. Did you think of any others he didn't mention? What lessons could there be from the ones you thought of?
- Read Psalm 55. What lessons can we learn from the psalmist's experience amidst life's storms? Would you be willing to share a particular storm you find yourself in this season of life? May the others in your group pray for you to find both peace and purpose amidst the storm?

Sanctuary Discussion Questions::

Read and ponder the text of Acts 27. What does the Holy Spirit draw your attention to? Why? Be reminded of the words used by Kevin to organize his teaching in recent weeks:

6/16-Resurrection 6/23-Prayer 6/30-Blameless 7/7-Testify

7/14-Storms

Do these organizing words from previous weeks have any impact on this week's word: Storms? If so, please share your insights.

As you read Acts 27, what challenges were Paul and shipmates facing in these major storms? Have you ever experienced similar threats in the storms of your life? How did Paul respond? How did

you respond? Where was the Lord in your storms?

From the text of Acts 27, Kevin offered some possible action steps as we face the storms of life. Be reminded that our action steps are opportunities to join in the Acts 1:8 mandate. They are:

Abide/remain in Christ.

Be a "secret agent" of hope.

Offer specific and tangible encouragements as the Spirit directs: words, supernatural insight, hospitality, perspective, prayer.

Testify to the hope you have amidst the storm.

Serve in the storms—willingly, regularly and hopefully.

Will you pray for each other? Pray for victory and courage in the storms being faced.
