- Please read Genesis 12:1-3 and Jeremiah 29:4-7, 11-14. What words or phrases are quickened within you as you seek to apply these passages in becoming a people who BLESS?
- Please read and compare Jeremiah 29:4-7, 11-14 with Psalm 137. The location of both texts is the same but the tone is so different. Why? If you were exiled which text would rule your life? Why?
- Why might "the Lord God Almighty" (5x) send those He loves into exile? If the reason is not to BLESS, what else could it be?
- What does the Lord's sending people into exile reveal about His missional heart?
- Review the BLESS strategy (on page 1). Could you share some ways you have applied these action steps as you sought to BLESS these past 12 weeks?

Think about world events in your lifetime. What significant events "changed the narrative" in our world?

- Read Matthew 23. Based on Jesus' words to the religious leaders of his day, what was the "Narrative" that they were teaching the people? How did the narrative Jesus was telling contrast with it?
- As we move into a year focused on "Kingdom Multiplication" lets think about those in our circles of influence who are not followers of Christ. If the non-believers you know were to describe the narrative they typically hear from "Christians" or "the Church" what do you think they would say? How do you think Jesus would have us change the narrative of the stories we are telling?
